Man Let Down Through the Roof

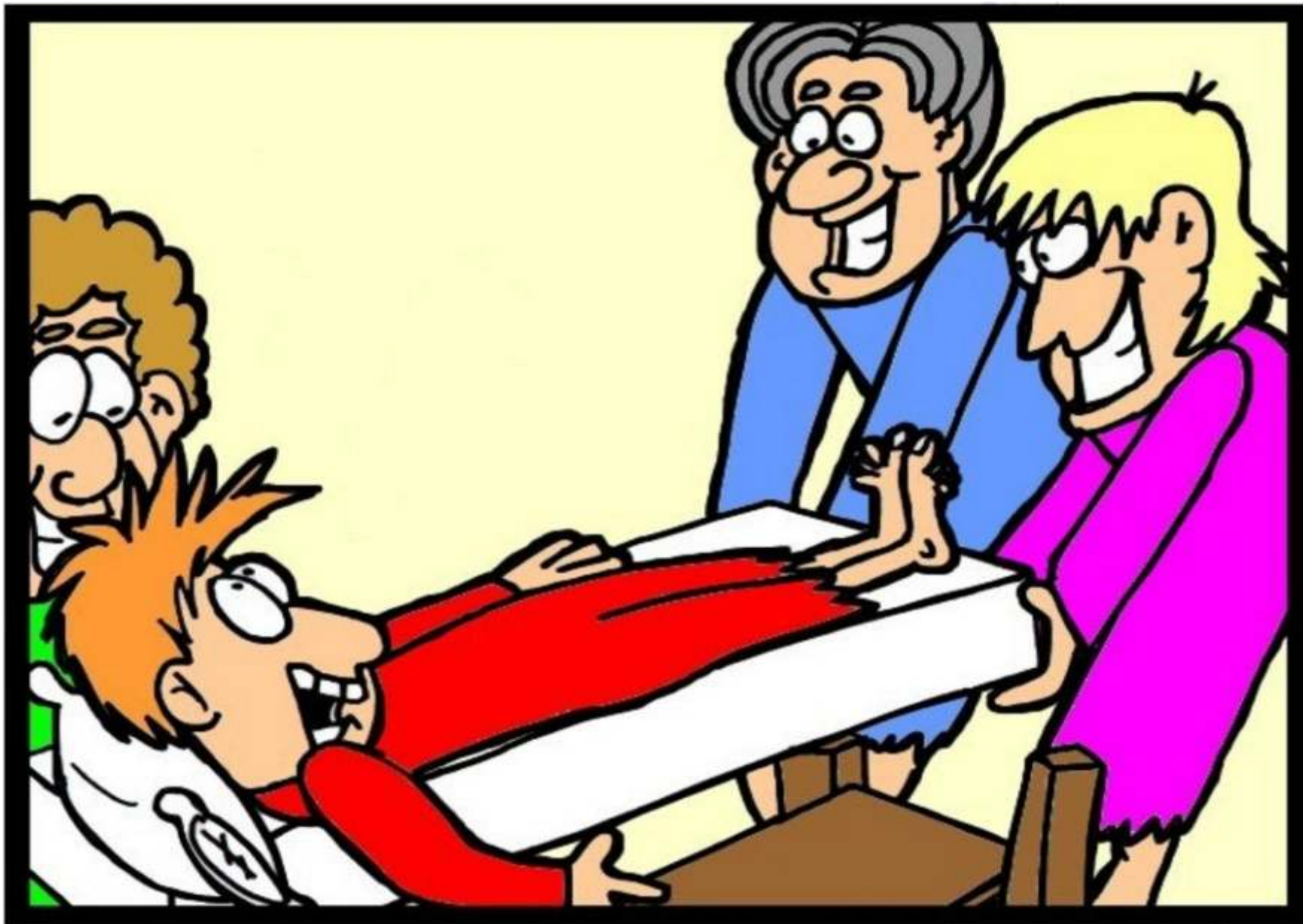

“We can’t get in the doors. We can’t get in the windows. Hey! I have an idea let’s take him up on the roof,” said one of the men.



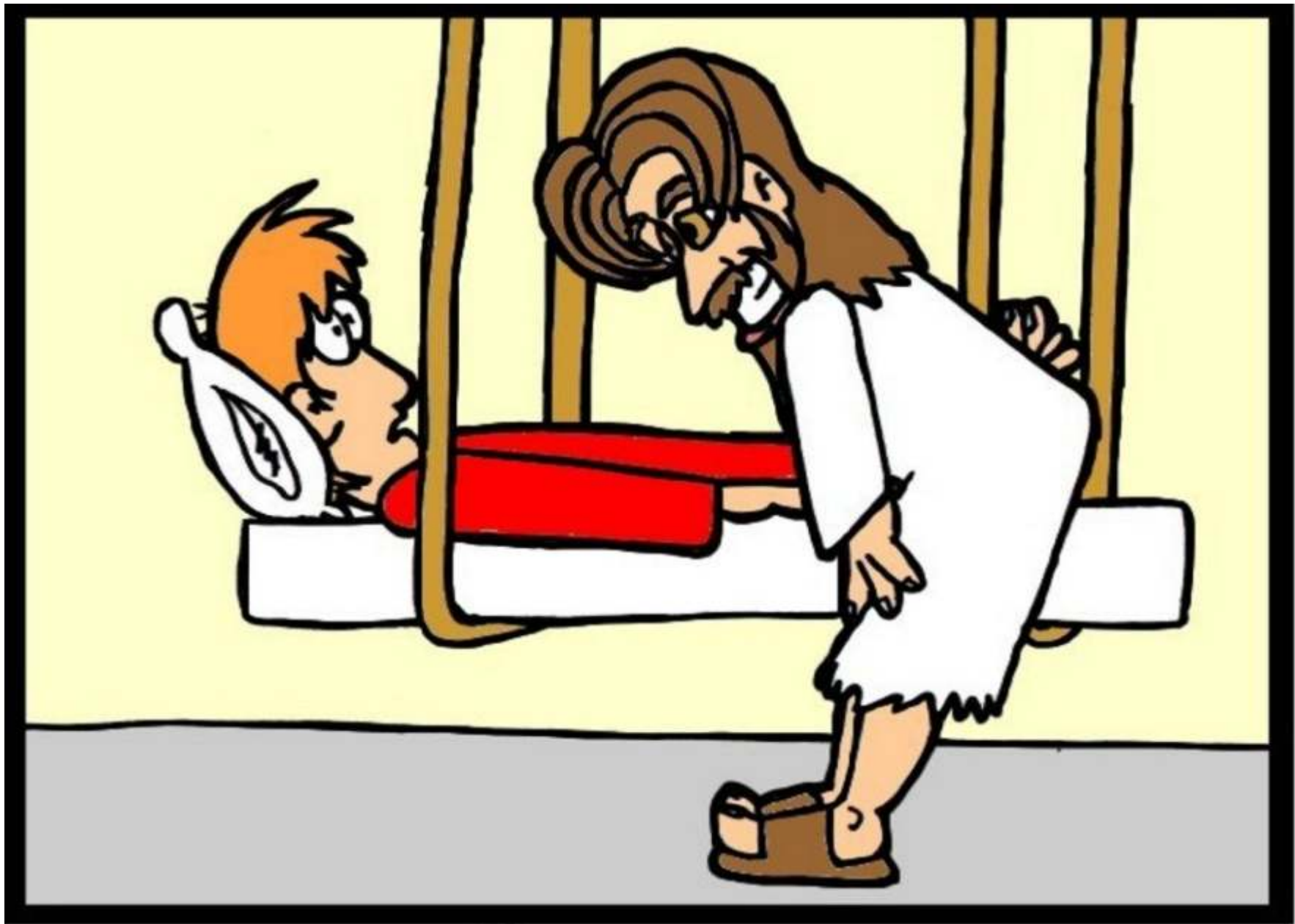

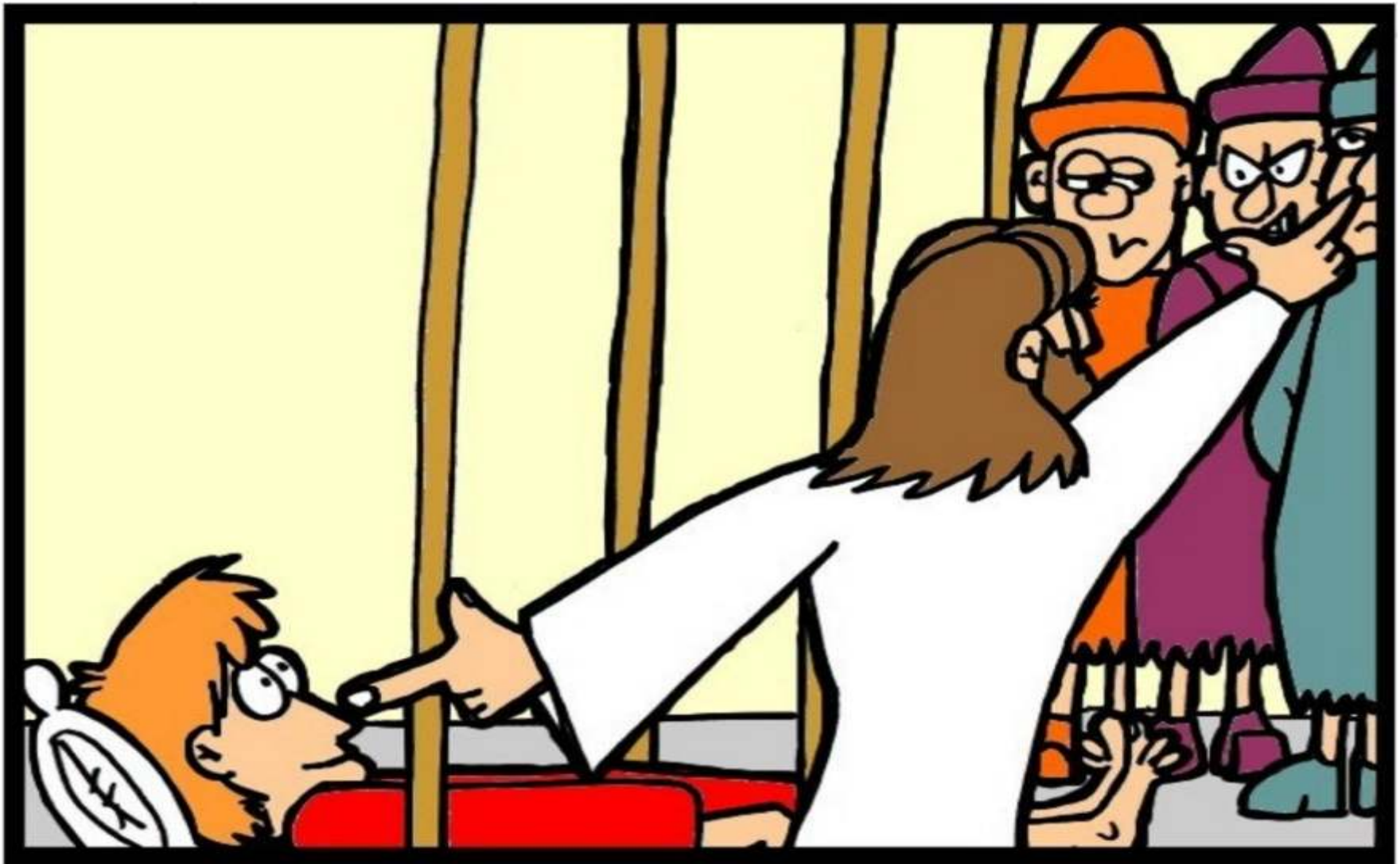
